Commentary on the Gospel for Wed, May 31st 2017

Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary

I started to ponder over this reflection after attending St. Cecilia's Cathedral celebration of the first appearances of the Virgin Mary on May 13, 1917 in Fatima, Portugal. Several years ago, I worked for a law firm here in Omaha. I took three months for maternity leave after the birth of my first son. While devastated at the time, I can look back and realize what a blessing this time was for me and my family. I chose to become a stay at home mom and had two additional babies. I deepened and grew in my faith and eventually made my way to the Catholic Church. During that journey, I found Mary and how much I love her.
