We do not fast to get something out of it from God. It is done as a penance and also to unite ourselves with the poor (Family Fast Day). We taste their lives, to weep over their sad and hungry children, to feel their helplessness. By fasting and giving alms, by sharing our bread and sheltering the oppressed, we stop turning our back on our own, as Isaiah announced. Fasting reunites us with our true family. It teaches us the true values of life.
